Dear Normandy Families,



- Sharing a school appropriate joke/comedic skit



Everything You Need to Know About

Auction SIGN-UP PARTIES

What is an auction sign-up party?

An auction sign-up party is a party hosted by a member of the Normandy community. The host chooses the theme/activity and plans all of the necessary arrangements (location, date, number of attendees, how much to charge per attendee), including covering all costs. Auction attendees will buy "slots" to the party at the auction (at the pre-determined price and limited to the set number of attendees). No bidding involved!

Sign-up parties are great opportunities to socialize with old friends, make new ones, bond over common interests, and increase school spirit within our community. Plus, we are raising money for Normandy!

How does a sign-up party make money for Normandy?

The host pays for all costs of the party. The dollar amount for every slot sold goes directly to Normandy. So basically, there are two donations involved in the sign-up parties: the host is donating his/her time, energy, planning, and funds to have the party; a partygoer is donating his/her money to buy a slot to the party. This is a fun and unique way for everyone to contribute to this year's auction!

Who can buy a slot to a sign-up party?

ANYONE. That's right, anyone—as long as the party is not sold out, you can buy a slot! You don't know the host? That makes it even better, because it's a fantastic chance to get to know fellow Normandy parents.

How much does it cost to attend a sign-up party (per slot)?

The cost can vary, and the host decides how much to charge to attend his/her party. Here are some general guidelines when setting the cost to attend:

- If a children's activity, the price is around \$15-\$30 per child.
- If an adult party without much food/drinks or time, the price is around \$25 per person.
- If an adult or family party that provides dinner or a lot of entertainment/long hours, the price is around \$40–\$60 per person/family.

Remember, the price to attend is really a donation to our school as every dollar goes to Normandy.

Who can host a sign-up party?

ANYONE. It doesn't matter if you are new to Normandy or have been at the school several years—if you have an idea for a sign-up party, make it happen! Worried about the cost involved? Recruit another parent or family to host with you!

What should I do if I want to host a sign-up party?
