

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

Physical Education

Welcome Back! This month the students will be learning to manipulate long handled sticks and short handled sticks in Scooter hockey! Hockey is a great way to practice stick handling skills. Using scooters also allows students to gain some upper body strength. They will also get to try both offensive and defensive positions.

Music Notes

Time is quickly flying by in the music room. We have a lot planned from now until the end of the year! We'll continue practicing our musicianship skills as well as learning new skills.

5th and 6th grades are working on their guitar skills for these next 2 rotations. We are first working on fret numbers, then reading single note melodies, and we'll end our unit with chords. **4th grade** is working on reading more complex rhythm patterns and expanding our vocal range with new solfege notes. We are also learning and practicing new songs on the recorder.

3rd grade is focusing on singing, playing, reading, and moving to music in 3-beat meter.

2nd grade is learning new solfege notes. We spent a long time focusing on just three notes by reading, writing, singing, and playing. Now we are adding new notes to learn! We are also learning about tied rhythms and half notes.

1st grade has arrived at learning about beat! This is the very beginning of learning music definitions. It is such an exciting time. We've worked months showing the beat with our bodies, now we are able to define it and label it.

Orff Ensemble is being offered Thursday afternoons immediately after school. It was a way for students to learn xylophones, percussion, and recorders outside of the music classroom. Our rehearsals will be geared toward a final performance on Thursday, March 1st.

Colorado Elementary All-State Choir is held this month. Six of our students will represent Normandy in this wonderful opportunity. Isabel Pritchard, Ellie Sykes, Jenavie Tran, Chloe Watson, Carson Cash, and Ryan Lee have been working hard and will make Normandy very proud!!!

Troubadours and Mini Minstrels are on break until the week of February 26th.

Technology

Today, technology comes to us in many forms and at Normandy we like to expose our students to a wide variety of educational technology experiences in order to help prepare them for their future. Just as we have a variety of technology in our homes we try to provide similar variety at school. We have no idea where our students will be in 10-20 years yet alone what they might be doing with tech. This week the Consumer Electronics Show brought out all the bells and whistles of new advances but for now we need to stick with tried and true technology in the district in order to protect everyone's privacy. Jeffco is very strict in protecting our students' privacy online and we continue that lesson at Normandy. Our kindergarten and first graders recently learned about computer privacy by learning about usernames and passwords for logging onto our computers. We will continue this discussion about privacy online by looking at our digital footprint in older grades during the coming weeks. At home you can continue this conversation about online safety by monitoring the sites your child visits and the kind of information you allow to be shared online. A couple items I will remind the students is, "Once you've written/posted online there is no erasing it" and "If you wouldn't say the words you type out loud don't type them either." Artistic Endeavors

Most grades are currently working in the threedimensional realm using materials such as clay, wire, and paper mache. It is exciting to see the students using their fine motor skills in a different manner as they make their art creations. The following information explains current and upcoming concepts at each grade level.

First grade: Currently, they are learning about sequence and pattern while exploring geometric shapes to create a wall hanging using clay. This concept will continue as they learn how it creates rhythm in an artwork.

Second grade: Second graders have been exploring portraits and self-portraits, and learning how artists communicate emotion through color and facial expression. Landscapes and color groups will follow in the third trimester.

Third Grade: Learning about public art and how an artist makes a proposal for a public art piece has been the current activity. Students will follow this by making mobile sculptures that will hang in the art room and other areas of the building. This will be a science integrated unit in which they learn about kinetic energy and different types of levers.

Fourth grade: Fourth graders are currently making awesome medieval clay dragons as an extension to their medieval studies in their homerooms. The dragons will be placed in a three dimensional landscape. Color schemes will be investigated in the third trimester.

Fifth Grade: Recently they have been learning about contour drawings, gesture drawings, and learning how to draw the figure in correct proportions. Figurative sculptures are then made using pipe cleaners and paper mache. In the third trimester they will explore linear perspective.

Sixth grade: Recently, they have finished self-portraits using different values of torn paper. They have just started their clay unit which is inspired by ancient Greek pottery. They will learn various hand-building techniques. High and low contrast will be learned as they decorate their clay pots.

Andrea Steinberg, LSW



Dear Families of Future Columbine Students,

I am very excited and proud to announce that Columbine High School has been chosen, as one of a select group nationally, to offer the Advanced Placement (AP) Capstone Diploma Program. Columbine will be the first AP Capstone Diploma School in Jefferson County and one of the few statewide.

The AP Capstone Diploma program is a challenging program for motivated students. It is built on the foundation of our existing AP courses while adding two AP courses -- AP Seminar and AP Research -- and is designed to complement and enhance the in-depth, discipline-specific study experienced in other AP courses. Through earning an AP Capstone Diploma, students will be able to earn college course credit, college admission distinction, and valuable college and workforce readiness skills. AP Capstone is an innovative program that equips students with the independent research, collaborative teamwork, and communication skills that are increasingly valued by colleges.

In order for students to earn an AP Capstone Diploma they will have to:

- Pass 4 AP Exams of their choice throughout their four years in high school.
- Take and pass the exams and requirements for both AP Seminar and AP Research.

Columbine has maintained a strong AP program for many years, and our students have had a great deal of success in the many AP courses and on the AP exams. Last year, we had 416 students take 761 exams, and 70% of those students earned a passing score of 3 or greater on those exams. In addition, 56 students were AP Scholars, students who earned a 3 or better on 3 or more AP exams. Therefore, we feel strongly that the AP Diploma is attainable and within reach for many of our students.

Students at Columbine that complete the AP Capstone program could have their freshman year of college completed before they graduate from high school!
