

Last spring our 3rd through 6th grade students participated in the Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) state assessments, and we have exciting news to share. Not only did the overall percentage of students who met or exceeded state expectations increase in English Language Arts, Math, and Science, our overall rate of growth increased too! Normandy's growth report reflects a year's worth of growth or more in English Language Arts and Math. Each of our subgroups (ie – individual grade levels/males/females/English Language Learners/etc.) also observed a year's worth of growth or more for these two content areas. Last, Normandy students exceeded the district and state averages for achievement and growth. Way to go Normandy Knights! We are very proud of you!

Hard to believe that we have been in school for 6 weeks! A lot has happened in a short amount of time, including Field Day! Thank you to everyone who took time out of their busy schedules to support your students in a day of fun and friendly competition. The first Pacer test has been completed for grades 4-6. This is one way to measure the students' aerobic capacity. Aerobic activity is a component of physical fitness that is important to Elementary School students. Students should accumulate 60 min of age appropriate physical activity each day.

The older grades are enjoying the nice weather and practicing their eye-hand coordination while "Stuck in the Mud."

The younger grades have been learning about spatial awareness (where they are in relation to other students), and self-control of their bodies. Sometimes, this is a hard lesson learned with a few bumps and bruises!

Hello from the Music Room! I have had such a wonderful time getting to know all of my new students and getting to share with them my love for music. The upper grades are working on some very difficult pieces with layered ostinatos and complex melodies. We sing these parts and play them on the barred instruments. The upper grades are also working on composing rhythms and performing them in interesting ways.

The Lower grades are learning about basic music elements such as high/low, Slow/fast all the while learning the names of these basic musical concepts. There is a lot of singing, movement and playing of instruments in the classroom. I am also very excited that Kindergarten is having specials this year. I have taught kindergarten before in my previous position in Englewood, and it is always wonderful to see students grow from such an early age. I am very happy to be at Normandy and I want to thank the staff, students and the community for being so welcoming and supportive.

We have the Troubadours/ Mini Minstrels concert coming up on November 29th with a selection of a few Holiday, nature and fun songs that we are very excited to perform for our community.

Artistic Endeavors Mr. McConnell

As you may already know, a fundraiser for art through Original Works will begin on October 8th. There will be posters promoting the fundraiser hanging inside the front entrance and office as well as product samples to look at. As the fundraiser progresses you will receive updates. I have done this fundraiser in the past and parents and students were very happy with the results! I also wanted to update you on what each grade level is working on in art:

- Kindergarten is learning about line types and line direction while incorporating primary and secondary colors.
- First grade is focusing on how artists tell stories through their art.
- Second grade first trimester looks at overlapping using geometric and organic shapes.
- The third graders are learning about color schemes and their relation to emotions and ideas.
- The first trimester for fourth grade looks at the concept of abstract art in the two and three dimensional realms.
- Fifth grade is learning about the elements that go into making a good composition.
- Sixth grade is currently working on a self-portrait that includes an animal that relates to them metaphorically.

Guidelines for using our Buddy Benches:

When you sit on the Buddy Bench

- Before you sit on the Buddy Bench, think of something you would like to do. Ask someone else to play with you.
- The bench isn't for socializing. Only sit there if you can't find anyone to play with.
- While you're sitting on the bench, look around for a game you can join.
- If you see something you want to do, or a friend you want to talk to, get off the bench!
- If you're sitting on the bench, play with the first classmate who invites you.
- Keep playing with your new friends!

When you see someone sitting on the Buddy Bench

- Start by saying hello. If you don't know the person, introduce yourself.
- Make conversation. What's up? How are you? I like your shoes.
- Ask them to play with you or suggest an activity you can do together.
- Don't make it the last time you hang out. Keep playing with your new friend!








BIKE OR WALK TO SCHOOL DAY
